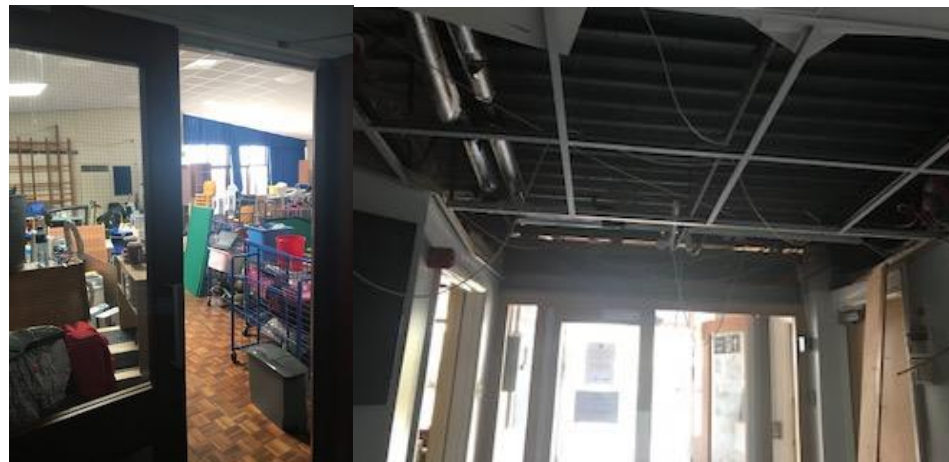
We would like to welcome you all back finally to school and thank you for your patience and understanding. Although only back these two days I thought we should start the year with the weekly Friday's newsletter. It is a lengthy one this week as we have lots to share with you.

As you are all aware we have had some significant works take place throughout the summer holidays which were scheduled for completion on the 26th August. Unfortunately, as is the nature with construction, unforeseen difficulties were encountered which delayed the project by a further week. I was not informed of any delay other than not being permitted to be on site until the Wednesday 29th. Once in school I could see how far behind the project was. We had been assured that all our learning spaces; although would be worked in, would remain protected and undisturbed. This was far removed from the scene I was greeted with last week.

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I hope that you can see from the snapshot view that not only was our school not a safe environment for the children to access it was a long way off from being the learning environment required to start our year. The teaching staff and Learning Support Staff have worked throughout the end of their holiday and these past three days to restore our school. We have moved heavy furniture, cleaned, mopped, reconnected technology which has all been on top of the usual prepping for the beginning of a new term in readiness for the children starting. I can however, confirm that our school is an asbestos free site.

Amidst the upheaval we had the distressing news that our school guinea pigs had been stolen from our school grounds. Our two gorgeous piggies had been cared for throughout the summer in Mrs Rodger's home and my home. I had brought them back to school upon returning so that they could enjoy the larger hutch space. Upon notification that they had been seen close by; myself, Mrs Stock and Mrs Lees went on a guinea pig hunt. We located the hutch first which had been cruelly thrown into some bushes and was badly damaged with the food bowl and water canister missing. Eagle-eyed Mrs Stock found the darker one (Sweep) and after some time we managed to successfully return him to school. Over the weekend the builders fixed his hutch while I purchased new feeding bowls and bottles, but all was not ok as he was lonely. All sorts of rumours were flying about such as they had been abandoned all summer, they were found on Amounderness Way or worse! We then received a call to notify us that the pale white guinea pig (Sooty) amazingly had been found. They squealed with delight as reunited. I was desperately upset that someone could do this to a living creature and especially when on school

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property. Due to the concern that this could happen again the guinea pigs are now going to live with Mrs Lees and will visit school. A local neighbour very kindly donated £10 to help us repair the hutch which as had been done, will put towards a new run for them. We are, in light of this to reflect on Romeo's introduction into school and plan to delay him being in school for the near future.

We have learned that there has been a lot of activity on our school grounds during the evenings and are going to look into possibly getting some CCTV to protect our school site along with supporting the local neighbourhood. We will keep you posted.

Miss Murray our Deputy Headteacher and Miss Birch the teacher in Herons, have started with us and we hope they will be very happy at our school. Toast is to continue to be offered at playtimes as a snack for KS2 as the KS1 and EYFS children are given fruit in the mornings. To further support our mission to lead healthier lives with a balanced diet we would love it if the KS2 pupils would bring in items of fruit to enjoy when sharing a class novel in their classes. We are very mindful though that to be healthy it is about eating for enjoyment and therefore everything needs eating in moderation and so are introducing a Fairy Cake Friday option to coincide with the treat lunches. Each class are asked to bake a set of cakes to sell to their peers in their phase on a Friday. Money raised will be announced on the newsletter and used by the classes themselves.
