We rarely will cover absences with supply teacher and so have invited Mrs McKone to provide the cover needed in Robins as she knows our school well due to training as a teacher with us.

Our Carleton Code is something we hold dear to us at school, where expected behaviour is acknowledged and rewarded. Our behaviour policy has been built around the ethos of our codes with most pupils able to meet our expectations. For a minority of pupils this expectation is beyond their reach and usually this is due to a special need. Where we can identify the special need, we endeavour to provide support to overcome the barrier, as we would if it were a physical or a learning need. All pupils are expected to be able to access an education that is safe. With this in mind we will exclude pupils if their conduct is proving detrimental to the learning of others.

On Thursday 18th October, we will be welcoming Reverend Boyd into our school again to lead our Harvest festival assembly for the whole school. The focus will be on saying thank you for what we have as a school family but also on looking at those less fortunate than ourselves we would be grateful for any harvest donations that Reverend Boyd can use to help homeless people in our local community. Donations of: tinned foods, packets of instant pasta, rice, noodles, pot noodles, gloves, shampoo, shower gel, shaving foam and socks would be very gratefully received.
