It is vital that children are in school to be able to make the expected progress in their learning, yet we have recorded 111 pupils have been below the expected attendance figure of 96% at some point since September, which means a third of our school have not had full access to their education and as such are unable to realise their potential. We are working very hard this year to ensure learning is pitched appropriately, is engaging and purposeful as well as thoroughly marked to feedback next steps to improve further.
