Since taking over the running of Early Bird and Late Larks; I have been proud with how we have remained committed to ensuring your children are well cared for along with enabling our families' flexibility with booking. Sadly, we are not able to sustain the level of flexibility we have afforded to date as too many bookings are being made outside of school hours which means we are not able to inform our EB and LL staff to meet the ratios of adult to child and instead are having to deploy the teaching staff. This Monday we had an additional 25 bookings to those we had known about during the working week. We are therefore moving towards a system whereby we ask that you have booked and paid on ParentPay slightly in advance:

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If your child is not booked in and we do not have any availability left; I am sure you will understand that we cannot allow the child-care to take place. Please do not place the team that work in the Early Bird and Late Larks, in an uncomfortable position by turning up without a confirmed booking. Our policy has been amended to reflect this change. Uncollected children at the end of the school day are recorded on our safeguard log with repeated incidences reported to Social Services. This protocol is held within our Child Protection and Safeguarding Policy. Thank you for your support.

The year 6 pupils are starting to prepare for their end of year production and leavers' assembly. As part of this they are to learn some poems that they are to perform. We are to see how good they are at public speaking to then take forward the best performers to represent us at an interschool Choral Speaking Competition at Boundary Primary School on the 4<sup>th</sup> July which will take place within the school day.



We are sadly having a lot of difficulties with teenagers climbing over onto our school grounds during our evenings. We have heard reports of their foul language, weeing in our grounds and about their activities on our two-story roof. We have painted anti-vandal paint on our buildings today and have ordered CCTV in an attempt to detract their endeavours to conduct themselves in such an unsavoury manner within our lovely school.

We had a really good turn-out for our Parent Forum on Tuesday evening where we discussed the steps taken within school to promote desirable behaviour. We discussed the policy as well and it was felt that parents would like to be informed should their child require time out of class and therefore our policy will be amended to include this. The consensus was that the majority of our pupils behave impeccably well and therefore we are all (parents, school and our children) doing a great job. We then went on to talk about the changes being made to the relationships education. We already cover a lot of the
