This has been a brilliant week with many celebratory elements. Much learning has taken place outside using our gorgeous school grounds with Yellow Ducklings and Brown Ducklings: Counting to 10 and 20. Water painting names, letters and numbers. Chalking numbers and counting actions such as hops, skips etc. Herons: Using 100 square - 1 more 1 less. Robins: local environment - plants and animals. Owls: Numeracy - 10 more / 10 less. Sharing a class novel outside. Doves: Numeracy - ordering and comparing numbers Kestrels: Numeracy - ordering and comparing numbers, Falcons: Geography and Drama and Eagles: Geography - the world we live in. Longitude and Latitude.

I have enjoyed showing prospective parents around school also and each visitor has commented how welcoming and calm our school feels and what lovely children we have.

It was mentioned last week that teachers were late out from a meeting on the Friday morning. I sincerely apologise for this. We have moved our meeting to an earlier time slot to prevent our delay in meeting and greeting your children.

Safeguarding your children is paramount to all that we do. Our gates are locked during the school day and when afterschool club is in operation to ensure our grounds are secure and safe to use. We therefore want all children collected from afterschool activities from the front entrance and only by people you have named on your data sheets. If you feel that an older sibling is able to collect your child from school or an afterschool activity please put this wish in writing. We are to have a doorbell fitted to this front door to assist you when picking your child up.

Last week you were asked to have a read through our behaviour policy on our website. This week we wondered if you would kindly complete the questionnaire at the end of this newsletter. Please hand into your child's class teacher when completed. You may place them in an envelope if you prefer to send an anonymous response. Thank you.

(There is no section 3 to your questionnaire in case you were thinking we had missed it off.)

Each class in school plans to meet the needs of the children within. The children's individual needs and next steps are planned for under a topic. These topics are on a two year rolling programme so that pupils are not disengaged in their learning. It is very important to us that pupils are motivated in their learning and can see a purpose. For children to learn and thrive they need to be happy which is our overriding ethos at Carleton Green. It is for these reasons that we wanted to ensure we provide a breadth and wealth of experiences with clear progression of skills developed over the years from entry to leaving at the end of Year 6. Continual provision is set up and is running throughout the day in Ducklings so that our youngest pupils can learn through play and application. Our year 1 pupils still have opportunities to learn through play yet the teachers plan to move their learning on with more focused activities than when in Ducklings. I visit the children throughout each day and I can honestly say all our children are happy learning in their new classes.

The extra-curricular activities are held weekly to enable children to develop new skills with trips planned for every class. Residential visits are planned for our Year 5 and 6 pupils with an overnight sleepover in school for our Year 4 pupils. We want these residential trips to create very different experiences for our pupils along with their acquiring some life skills and furthering learning. Last year we took children to the Lake District to experience life in the outdoors while another group were taken to London to see the sights of our capital city and watch a show. Both of these trips were highly successful. Unfortunately the risk posed by a possible terrorist attack is halting our plans in repeating this for our current year 5 and 6 pupils. So we have secured bookings for our year 6 pupils to spend time having fun in the Lakes with the year 5 pupils spending time away whilst furthering their learning about a contrasting seaside location. We hope that you can understand why we are changing our plans but can see we are still keeping in line with our philosophy.
